OLD BUSINESS

The K4R Licence renewal has not been received in part due to the BCGEU strike.

NEW BUSINESS

- Harvesting has commenced on CP 404 – 2023 Pinkut/Hanney wildfire area.
- Archaeological assessments have been completed, report should be received soon.
- Chinook waste assessments continue to be below the district average.
- A new fence will be installed at the Chinook-Ootsa recreation site.
- FLP Open Houses will be held in November.
- Began work with Rec Sites and Trails BC to determine what can be done to clean up the Walk-a-dab trail near Rose Lake.
